PREPARATION AND WAITING

JOHN PREPARES THE WAY FOR JESUS From Matthew 3

At that time John the Baptist came to the desert of Judea and started preaching. "Turn away from your sins," he said, "because the Kingdom of heaven is near!" John was the man the prophet Isaiah was talking about when he said,

"Someone is shouting in the desert, prepare a road for the Lord; make a straight path for him to travel!"

John's clothes were made of camel's hair; he wore a leather belt around his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. People came to him from Jerusalem, from the whole province of Judea, and from all over the country near the Jordan River. They confessed their sins, and he baptized them in the Jordan.....

"I baptize you with water for repentance. But after me comes one who is more powerful than I, whose sandals I am not worthy to carry. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire...." Advent is a time of preparation,

as we look forwards to Christmas and the birth of Jesus, but it is also a time of waiting; waiting for Jesus to return again. John the Baptist pointed the way to the arrival of Jesus and called people to prepare by turning back to God and confessing their sins. It was to be a new start for them, and baptism in the water, symbolised that new beginning.
