The East Windows were unveiled at a packed service on 13th December 1906. Donated by their five surviving children, the window celebrates the life of John and Elizabeth Creemer-Clarke, whose time, talents and generous donations made this wonderful building possible. The window is a replica of five of the panels of Sir Joshua Reynolds' west window in New College, Oxford. It depicts five virtues - Mercy, Faith, Charity, Hope and Justice.
