Advent is a time of waiting and preparation – waiting for the birth of Jesus and preparing ourselves for his coming. What is Eco Church?

Eco Church is an awards scheme run by A Rocha UK which helps churches to care for creation in practical ways. It provides a framework for churches to take actions to help care for God's earth using a self-administered survey covering five key areas: worship and teaching, buildings and energy, land and nature, community and global engagement, and lifestyle. Churches can earn points and work towards Bronze, Silver, or Gold Eco Church awards.

The Eco Church movement started in 2016 and is run in partnership with Christian Aid, Tearfund, the Church of England, the Methodist Church, the United Reformed Church and the Benefact Trust (formerly the All Churches Trust).

Trinity is just starting to look at applying for an Eco Church award, working alongside the Methodist circuit which is considering an application to become an Eco Circuit.
