### **February Eco Tip - Using Your Buying Power Wisely**

As consumers we all have power that can be used to the good - to buy local, buy fairtrade or in other ways to avoid products and services which are unethically produced or environmentally damaging (such as single use plastics).

At any one time there are particular companies which many people are boycotting - for instance because of their investments in arms or fossil fuels, for unethical promotion of unsafe products or for poor employee practices.

The magazine/website "Ethical Consumer" ([/www.ethicalconsumer.org](http://www.ethicalconsumer.org)) scores companies and products on an array of ethical practices. You can also subscribe to the magazine/website or read/borrow copies from the Trinity Church foyer or the Climate Emergency Centre (CEC) in the basement of the Abingdon Guildhall

### **Please Act Now for a Fairer Future**

The UK government is considering a new law that would help protect people and the environment. It would require big companies to take responsibility for human rights abuses and environmental harm in their supply chains — issues such as deforestation and pesticide use, or women earning less than men on tea farms.
