Foodbank

Abingdon Foodbank had a busy Christmas season, giving out Christmas hampers to 388 families. In our regular work in 2025, we responded to over 2500 requests for help, serving 577 families. Add in the extra families we served with Christmas hampers as well as during the summer holidays and we reached over 800 families in Abingdon and the surrounding villages. Demand after Christmas is always a bit slower but still new people are coming to us.

Do download our BanktheFood app to see quickly and easily what items Abingdon Foodbank needs, but we always need tinned meat, squash, UHT milk, custard and rice pudding, washing up liquid and surface spray. Thank you for your support throughout 2025: we wouldn't manage without it.
